

Community Engagements January – December 2023

Between January and December 2023 the Neighbourhood Policing Team completed **946 Community Engagements** within the Chippenham Town and Rural Neighbourhood Policing areas.

Week of Action

The Neighbourhood Policing Team conducted a week of action between 27th November and 1st December 2023.

Monday 27th November - Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking

Officers carried out immigration and welfare checks at local businesses and visited various nail bars, car washes and building sites in the area to identify any potential offences related to immigration, modern slavery and human trafficking.

Tuesday 28th November – Misuse of Drugs Act Warrant

Wednesday 29th November – Rural Engagement (13 villages)

Thursday 30th November – Plain Clothes ASB Operation

A plain clothes policing operation was held following reports of ongoing anti-social behaviour and shoplifting.

Officers from the Neighbourhood Policing Team conducted the operation at Hathaway Retail Park arresting one youth for shoplifting. A further two youths have been arrested regarding the location since this date

OP Sceptre – 13th – 17th November 2023








Chippenham Town Crime and Incident Statistics
